STORM UPDATES: SANDBAGS AVAILABLE TO STOCKTON RESIDENTS Warming Zones Available Through Night of January 12

STOCKTON, Calif. – Rain and winds expected throughout Thursday, with additional storm conditions late Friday and into Sunday and returning Monday through Tuesday. To prepare for upcoming storms, City of Stockton self-service, self-fill sandbag locations will require identification with a Stockton address and be limited to 10 bags per visit. Warming Zone hours have been extended through the night of Thursday, January 12.

Storm-Related Services

- Sandbags Free self-service, sandbags are available for Stockton residents at two locations.
 - Must show ID with Stockton address.
 - Limit 10 bags per visit.
 - Self-service, self-fill, bring your own shovel.
 - Fill bags one-third to one-half full.
 - Sandbag supplies are renewed daily.
- Warming Zones Warming Zone availability has been extended through the night of Thursday, January 12, 2023. For locations and hours, visit www.stocktonca.gov/storm.

- Those without power, heat or shelter are welcome at any of the four (4) City of Stockton community centers.
- Face coverings, which will be provided at the door, are mandatory. All those staying must confirm that they are free of all COVID-19 symptoms by reviewing and completing a checklist.
- Community Centers During regular business hours, visit our <u>Community Center</u>
 Warming Zone locations or <u>public libraries</u> to charge cell phones.

Reporting Storm-Related Issues

- Report issues in the public right-of-way Report issues in the public right-of-way, such as fallen limbs and trees, signals, signs, and streetlights to the City of Stockton Municipal Service Center at www.stocktonca.gov/AskStockton or by calling (209) 937-8341. For emergencies, call 9-1-1.
- Power Outages Power has been restored to most areas. Report Power Outages
 or check the status of power in your neighborhood at <u>Pacific</u>, <u>Gas and Electric</u> Storms, Outages & Safety or call 1-800-PGE-5000.

- Travel Tips Local and neighborhood street flooding has subsided. Do not drive, ride,
 walk or wade through standing water. Travel with caution. Slow down. Watch for lane
 and street closures. Treat all dark or flashing traffic signals as "all-way stops." For

- Help Clear Fallen Leaves & Debris Please help your neighborhood by clearing leaves, branches, and storm debris away from storm drains near your home. Place yard waste, leaves, and organic debris in your organics waste cart.
